"Squires Month" is a great opportunity for your council to get on board with the Squire program by instituting or re-instituting a Squires circle. If your council or assembly already sponsors a circle, work with your Squires to set up a schedule of activities to celebrate "Squires Month," including the 4th Annual Washington State Squires Convention. This years meeting will convene in Lynnwood on April 23.



You might consider this month as an opportunity to promote awareness of the Columbian Squires Program within your church community. Many of our councils that have been involved with the Squires have found that this has been a very rewarding program that does much for our youth. The program provides the youth of your parish and community an opportunity to develop leadership skills. The Squires also promotes vocations and it provides a social, a recreational and a sporting activity outlet for young men. If you are a Grand Knight or Program Chairman, ask yourself if your council or community might benefit from this program. If so, take a look around the membership ranks and see if there may be a member within your council who might like to get involved with the youth. This may be a great program for that individual. This might be a way to engage a number of your council's members who would be fantastic working with the youth of your community.

In promoting the possibility of sponsoring a circle, keep in mind that potential Squires are everywhere. Knights' sons and nephews, young parishioners, altar servers, Catholic school students, even participants from your council's Free Throw Program, or any Catholic young men age 10 to 18 years old are potential members. 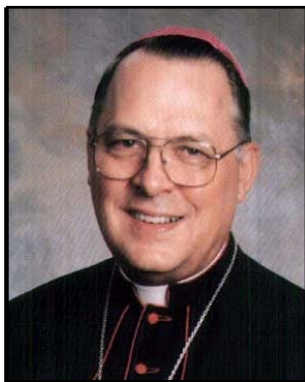

inscribed on the bottom of that ciborium, but I pray in a special way for those whose names are given me by the State Secretary.

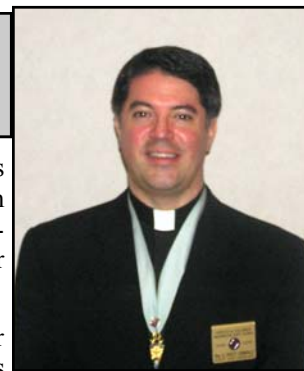
"To pray for the living and the dead" is a very important spiritual work of mercy. It is a privilege for me to pray for those mem-

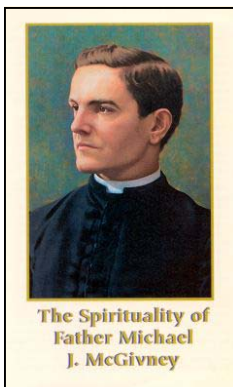

### Message from Vocations



Vocations in Washington State are doing very well, and I ascribe that in part to the fact that we are blessed with three very holy and loving Bishops. Currently, there

are 32 young men in training for the Archdiocese of Seattle, and another 33 studying for the remainder of the state. Worldwide, we also sponsor an additional 28 candidates for the priesthood and the consecrated life of a nun.

Knights of Columbus have a long-standing history of supporting our priests and seminarians. Of the four founders of the Serra Club, which was founded in Seattle, at least one was a member of the Knights of Columbus. Washington State Council has less than one percent of the total membership of the Order, yet provides one out of every thirty dollars (3.33 percent) of all monies given to seminarians through our RSVP program. In addition to that, we also contribute to a burse fund known as "Pennies for Heaven", which annually provides \$20,000 to each of our three Bishops to help defray costs of educating seminarians.

The time has come to forward your "Pennies for Heaven" checks to State Secretary Karl Hadley, along with a copy of the PFH form found in the Grand Knight's handbook. Of course, donations will be happily accepted at the convention - but early receipt of the funds makes my job easier.

April is the time for our second membership blitz of this fraternal year. We should have our list of candidates or potential candi-

### Insurance Message From State Treasurer



A number of councils across the State have received a liability insurance solicitation from a company in Kansas City, Mo. They were able to retrieve addresses

of the recipients from the internet. The solicitation is not endorsed or is it sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. However, it is cleverly worded and scripted by someone that knows something about the Knights. The heading makes it look like a K of C flyer. This type of insurance plan has been proposed to Supreme before and has been found to fall short of what is required to deal with the various functions of councils. There have been instances where they will not cover certain activities such as youth activities. They also require an additional premium when issuing certificates of insurance. Please do not pursue this insurance.

As you may know, the State Council is in the process of obtaining a new liability policy which will have better coverage than our previous plan. In addition, the cost to each council will be reduced. The plan will be formalized shortly and information will be forthcoming. We are waiting for council enrollment figures from Supreme in May to determine the cost per council. The new policy date will begin July 1, 2005.

On April 5, 2005, voters in Kansas will vote to amend the Kansas Constitution to preserve marriage as “constituted by one man and one woman only.” The Supreme Council of the Knights has sent a donation of \$100,000 to Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City to be used in a public education campaign in support of the marriage amendment. Archbishop Naumann said that “This extraordinary contribution by the Knights of Columbus will be of great assistance to the ecumenical and inter-faith efforts in Kansas to give constitutional protection to marriage between a man and a woman.”

Last year, voters in 13 states approved state constitutional amendments similar to the Kansas amendment, and a total of 17 states now have such provisions in their constitutions.

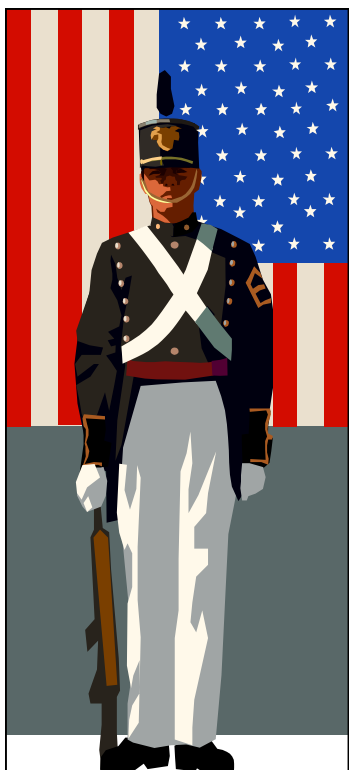

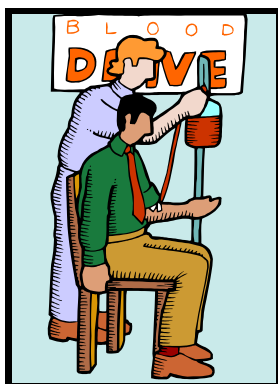
